LIBRARY NEWS

The Encinitas Library is once again reorganizing the team after LT I William Carleton transferred to La Mesa Branch to a full-time position, and LT II Hsuan Hsuan Wu retired. We wish them both the best on their new paths. Their job made a significant impact here, and they will be truly missed. Thank you for your valuable contributions! In addition to our library programs, October will also be busy with professional development. Youth Services librarians will be attending the SERRA Youth Services Conference at the San Diego Public Central Library.

The conclusion of the **Summer Learning Program** was a big success! On August 3, Hullabaloo hosted a children's concert with 200 patrons in attendance! The San Diego County Library (SDCL) Collection Development Team has communicated that the **Kid's Collection** will be growing (in some areas duplicating) over the next 5 years, and accommodations are being made now for the expansion. This will require increasing shelving with the purchase of additional gondolas and study spaces for children. Staff are looking to purchase additional AWE computer stations, teen



internet computers and study tables. The future of the library is in the hands of the next generation and it is important to invest in welcoming family spaces for all. **Encinitas 4 Equality tutoring** resumes in September. Students in Grades 3rd to 9th can work with a tutor in writing, math and reading. Tutoring will be available on Mondays and Thursdays every week until May 2024. Youth Services are being expanded. Due to community interest and high attendance, **Baby Storytime and Doggie Tales** are expanding to twice a month.



In honor of **Veteran's Day,** we will host a discussion about the USS Midway. A representative from the USS Midway will be here to give an interesting behind the scenes talk about how the Midway became the fifth most visited museum in the United States. The event will take place on Monday, November 6 at 11am. Join us at the library as we observe Veterans Day.



(Adult) The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together New York Times Bestseller by Heather McGhee

Heather McGhee's specialty is the American economy—and the mystery of why it so often fails the American public. Following a deeply personal journey across the country, McGhee finds proof of what she calls the Solidarity Dividend: the benefits we gain when people come together across race to accomplish what we simply can't do on our own. The Sum of Us is not only a brilliant analysis of how we arrived where we are but also a heartfelt message, delivered with startling empathy, from a black woman to a multiracial America. It leaves us with a new vision for a future in which we finally realize that life can be more than a zero-sum game.

(Teen) Iveliz Explains It All

Newbery Honor Award Winner by Andrea Beatriz Arango; illustrated by Alyssa Bermudez

How do you speak up when it feels like no one is listening? In this timely and moving novel in verse, Iveliz navigates seventh grade while facing mental health challenges. Powerful and compassionate, Andrea Beatriz Arango's debut explores finding your voice, advocating for the help and understanding you deserve, and discovering that those who really love you will stay by your side no matter what.

(Kids) Nigel and the Moon

by Antwan Eady; illustrated by Gracey Zhang

When Nigel looks up at the moon, his future is bright. He imagines himself as...an astronaut, a dancer, a superhero, too! But it's Career Week at school, and Nigel can't find the courage to share his dreams. It's easy to whisper them to the moon, but not to his classmates—especially when he already feels out of place. From debut author Antwan Eady and artist Gracey Zhang comes a glowing tale about the young dreaming big. A perfect story to demonstrate how pride in where we come from can bring a shining confidence.

BOOKSTORE NEWS

Thanks to all of you Members for bringing in your gently used books, CDs, DVDs, records, sheet music in books and puzzles! We have had a summer with lots of donations, but you need to keep them coming! At the moment we are low on newer fiction, art books, and classics. Please spread the word to your family members, neighbors and friends to bring their donations to our Bookstore. Library staff will accept small donations during the hours that we are not open. You can also check our website at www.encinitaslibfriends.org for our hours and other information. We accept 4 boxes/bags per person/day due to space issues.

Each month we have a 2/1Sale on one category in our collection. September was History which sold like hotcakes. Our **October Sale** is Sports, Pets and Animals. **November** the category is Blue Dot Books which are normally \$1/ea. This means they are 2/\$1 during November! Our Blue Dots are books that are All Time Favorites and Prize winning Literature that are not current but much loved. Check out this Sale on the Blue Carts outside as well as the large displays inside. These are on sale in their usual place as well. In **December** we bring out all the holiday books, CDs and DVDs that have been saved over the past year.

Sometimes customers miss some of our small but interesting sections in the Bookstore. Those are Humor, Large Print, True Crime, Westerns, Poetry & Essays and Short Stories. Ask our Volunteer where to find these categories. Do you know that most of our CDs are 2/\$1 and our DVDs are \$1 each? We are the best deal in town by far!

We have over 50 Volunteers now. Most Volunteers only work 2 shifts/month. Each shift is 3 1/2 hours. You can even volunteer to be just a Substitute. We really need subs. Just ask at the desk or inquire on our website. We now have 23 Sorters who go through all our donations to find those books that we can sell in our store or on Amazon. We support many of the free Children's and Adult programs that occur at our Library. The Library could not offer many of these programs without our support. Check out the Library Website for the program Schedule. Bookstore Sales also pay the musicians for our free monthly Sunday Concerts.

1st SUNDAY CONCERTS

October 1, 2023 - The Leonard Patton Quartet featuring Ed Kornhauser on Keyboards

Leonard Patton is one of the premier jazz vocalists in Southern California and has recorded and performed with some of the top musicians including Antonio Sanchez, Lionel Loueke, Peter Sprague and recently Pat Metheny. Mr. Patton is also the proprietor of the Jazz Lounge in San Diego. Ed Kornhauser is San Diego's jazz piano workhorse performing with all the top musicians in town and one of the most in demand pianists on the West Coast. He was named Best Jazz Artist of 2022 by the San Diego Music Awards.



November 5, 2023 – MandoBasso

"First -- curiosity. The simple incongruity forms a question mark. A big ol' bass and a high-pitched mandolin, side by side? Like throwing a growling mastiff in with a mewling kitten." -Gordon Johnson KCET But then listen to the music, and be convinced. MandoBasso is both the name of their duo and the name of their first album. Bill Bradbury plays the mandolin. Gunnar Biggs plays the bass. Together they play MandoBasso music. Crazy-quilt music. At its core is American country music, the kind heard floating on Smokey Mountain mists from the front porch of holler cabins. It's like a sip from the dipper of water drawn fresh from the well. But listen



some more and jazz influences become apparent as do classical underpinnings. Keep listening and Celtic music drifts in as do complex progressions borrowed from World Music. Crazy, but damn good.



December 3, 2023 – The Daneen Wilburn Gospel Sextet

Daneen Wilburn is one of San Diego's most sought-after Gospel and Jazz vocalists. She is the daughter of two Gospel quartet singers and grew up singing gospel with her five siblings: all musicians. This performance will showcase that musical history as she shares the stage with her two sisters, Margie Holmes and Joanna Broussard. She is accompanied by Richard Sellers on drums, Michael Kennedy on bass and Grammy Winner, Kamau Kenyatta on piano.

If you missed Daneen's last appearance at First Sunday Concerts do not make the same mistake again. Last year she had us openly weeping with her jazz and soul ballads. This year she is back with a world class band to enrich our Sunday and explore the roots of Jazz and Soul: a Gospel set, curated especially for us. The energy will be through the roof! This premium concert is made possible by a generous donation from the Betty Scalise Foundation which is dedicated to promoting live music in San Diego.





We celebrate our communities and dedicate our passion and expertise to help you create your own story. The agreement between SDCL and Laubach Literacy Council of San Diego is finalized. Laubach will provide free **literacy** and **English as a Second Language** (ESL) adult classes at various SDCL branches. Encinitas is one of those branches. We need to recruit students!

Once again, The Library will be partnering with Marilyn McPhie, President of **Storytellers of San Diego**, to host a workshop on Saturday, October 7 from 10 am to 12 pm in the community room. This will be a pilot program, and it will be evaluated for possible follow-up workshops. Professional storytellers will expertly guide participants through the creative process with storytelling resources and strategies.

The new Adult Services Librarian is starting a new **Book Club!** It will meet on the second Tuesday of the month at 5:30 pm on October 10 and November 14 with a break in December. Come in or call the library to sign-up and check-out a copy of the book. The first book we will read is *Nothing to See Here* by Kevin Wilson. Wilson's book is wholly original with an unlikely governess taking care of twins with an utterly unique problem – they can burst into flame. The story is funny and will generate a great conversation about family, parenthood, and privilege.



As part of the **Dia de los Muertos celebration**, the library will host a first session of an Altar Workshop on Thursday, October 19 from 3 to 6:30 pm. Facilitated by local artist Luis Murguia, participants make their own papier-mâché altar art object. All materials are provided, and everyone is welcome! On Friday, October 27, a second session of altar decoration, festivities that include mariachi, ballet folklorico, crafts, a poetry workshop and Ofrenda will take place from 3 to 6:30 pm. This celebration is in partnership with the City of Encinitas and is possible with generous funding from Friends of Encinitas Library. All are invited to honor the memory of a loved one by contributing a photograph or non-valuable remembrance to the Ofrenda which will be on display from October 24 through November 3. Encinitas Library expands beyond its walls to connect with the community in the form of MiraCosta's Dia de los Muertos event at the San Elijo campus. This event takes place on Sunday, October 29, 12 to 4 pm. SDCL will have a table and staff from Encinitas and Cardiff branches will be present to talk about library services.

Second Annual Poetry Takeover of Encinitas Library will take place on Saturday, November 4, 10:30 am to 4:30 pm. There will be workshops for kids and adults. Poetry winners will be invited to present their poems with a Community Open Mic Finale!
